Curatorial statement:

This pairing reflects on the quiet spaces between visibility and memory, labor and loss. It draws our attention to what often goes unnoticed—whether in the fading glow of analog technology or the silent movements of night work. Through meditations on time, obsolescence, and unseen effort, the works invite us to slow down, to revisit what has been left behind, and to honor the fragile, enduring presence of the past within the present.

Like Minds' special pick: Exploring a classic DIY film; Be Kind, Rewind where two bumbling store clerks inadvertently erase the footage from all of the tapes in their video rental store. In order to keep the business running, they re-shoot every film in the store with their own camera, with a budget of zero dollars. (Watch Trailer)

Mandoob (Night Courier) (Saudi Arabia, 2023): In the heart of Riyadh, where desperation and opportunity collide, MANDOOB brings forth the gripping tale of Fahad Algadaani, a mentally fragile man racing against time to save his ailing father. (Watch Trailer)

DOUBLE LIVES

Curatorial statement:

Though set worlds apart—Algiers in the shadow of historical trauma, and Hong Kong in the throes of organized crime—both films examine the blurred line between justice and deception. Through mirrored identities and fractured systems, they challenge our understanding of guilt, loyalty, and the self. These are not just thrillers—they are portraits of characters navigating shifting realities, where exposure is as dangerous as the secrets they carry.

Algiers (Algeria, 2024): The kidnapping of a little girl creates tension and suspicion in Algiers. Only Dounia, a brilliant psychiatrist, and Sami, a police inspector, can unearth the demons of the past. (Watch Trailer)

Soultrotter's special pick: a Hong Kong Crime Drama Idealistic police cadet Chan Wing-Yan is recruited by Police Superintendant Wong to go deep undercover as a member of the criminal Triad society. Into the same cadet class, crime boss Hon Sam installs new Triad member Lau Kin Ming to become a long-term mole for the gang. (Watch Trailer)

FUTURES ON HOLD

Curatorial statement:

Bringing CinamANA NYUAD to CineMAS with a program that brings together three strikingly original voices from the Arab world, each navigating the complexities of displacement, identity, and survival through deeply personal storytelling.

Mahdi Fleifel's <u>To A Land Unknown</u> (2024) is a raw, poignant exploration of exile and longing. It captures the psychological toll of statelessness, centering on characters whose dreams of escape are haunted by the impossibility of return. Through Fleifel's unflinching lens, we confront the human cost of borders—both physical and invisible. (WATCH TRAILER)

In Laila Abbas's darkly satirical <u>Thank You for Banking with Us</u> (2024), systems of power are laid bare in a surreal corporate landscape that reflects the absurdities of modern bureaucracy. Abbas weaves humor and horror into a searing critique of financial systems, where personal agency is swallowed by institutional machinery. The result is as chilling as it is sharp. (WATCH TRAILER)

Finally, Scandar Copti's <u>Happy Holidays</u> (2025) disarms with its biting wit and allegorical narrative. Beneath the surface of a seemingly festive occasion lies a deeper examination of collective memory, fractured societies, and the rituals we cling to in the face of instability. Copti's film challenges the comfort of nostalgia, replacing it with confrontation and reflection. (WATCH TRAILER)
